

Molaidhean airson Gàidhlig a Chleachdadh san Dachaigh

Bidh e na chuideachadh dhan chloinn san sgoil ma chleachdas sibh fiù 's beagan Gàidhlig san dachaigh!

1. Cleachd Gàidhlig gu spòrsail agus dèan moladh air a' chloinn uair sam bith a chleachdas iad Gàidhlig.
2. Cruthaich àrainneachd Ghàidhlig mar a leanas:
 - a. Rèidio/Ceòl Gàidhlig air fad an t-siubhail
 - b. Leabhraichean Gàidhlig ri làimh
 - c. Postairean no soidhnichean Gàidhlig
3. Èist ri faidhlichean clastinneach de leabhraichean leughaidh mus tòisich sibh air leughadh le ur pàiste. Mar sin, bidh barrachd misneachd agaibh nuair a thig gu fuaimean. (www.gaelic4parents.com)
4. Can facal no abairt (bhon fhaidhle clastinneach den leabhar leughaidh) agus iarr air ur pàiste a lorg san leabhar.
5. Cluich geamannan bùird a' cleachdadh faclan is abairtean Gàidhlig cho tric sa ghabhas cho math ri geamannan eile, leithid 'I spy sa Ghàidhlig' – 'Chì mise le mo shùil bheag'.
6. Cuir leubail Gàidhlig air rudan mun cuairt an taighe gus na faclan a chur nur cuimhne
7. Brosnaich ur pàiste gus facal ùr Gàidhlig ionnsachadh dhuibh gach latha.
8. Cuir air dòigh amannan cluiche còmhla ri clann eile aig a bheil Gàidhlig.
9. Coimhead BBC Alba agus brosnach a' chlànn gus prògraman chloinne a choimhead sa Ghàidhlig.
10. Coimhead cartùnaichean Gàidhlig le ur pàiste agus iarr orra seantans no dhà a sgrìobhadh mu dheidhinn na thachair no dealbh a dhèanamh.
11. Cuir air dòigh 'amannan Gàidhlig', m.e. àm-bìdh, a' dol dhan leabaidh, àm èirigh.
12. Ionnsaich abairtean Gàidhlig a ghabhas a chleachdadh le ur pàiste agus cleachd iad, mar eisimpleir, nuair a tha sibh a' coimhead air leabhraichean.

1. Nathraichean is Fàraidhean
2. Dominoes
3. Falach Fead (cunntadh)
4. Scrabble
5. Bananagrams
6. "Guess Who"
7. Chì mise le mo shùil bheag
8. Bingo (àireamhan)
9. "Twister"
10. Geamannan cuimhne, leithid 'Chaidh mi dhan bhùth agus cheannaich mi...'



Top Tips for using Gaelic at Home

Using even a little Gaelic at home will help children at school!

1. Make Gaelic fun and praise children whenever they use Gaelic.
2. Create a Gaelic environment by having:
 - a. Gaelic Radio/music on in the background.
 - b. Gaelic books available.
 - c. Gaelic posters or signs.
3. Listen to the audio files of reading books before starting to read with your child. That way you will be more confident of the sounds. (www.gaelic4parents.com)
4. Say a word or phrase (from the audio file of reading book) and ask your child to find it in the book.



5. Play board games using Gaelic words and phrases as much as you can and other games such as 'I spy' in Gaelic 'Chì mise le mi shùil bheag'.
6. Put a Gaelic label on everyday objects in the house to remind you of the words.
7. Encourage your child to teach you a new Gaelic word each day.
8. Arrange playdates with other Gaelic speaking children
9. Watch BBC Alba and encourage children to watch Gaelic children's TV.
10. Watch Gaelic Cartoons with your child and ask them to write a couple of sentences about what happened or to draw a picture.
11. Have 'Gaelic' times e.g. meals, going to bed, getting up.
12. Learn Gaelic phrases that you can use with your child and use them, for example, when looking at books.
